

#### PRAYER AFTER MASS

I thank You, holy Lord, almighty Father, eternal God, who deigned to feast me, sinful and unworthy servant, with the precious body and blood of Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, not for any merit of mine, but only because of Your merciful goodness. And I pray that this Holy Communion, far from condemning me to punishment, may bring about my pardon and salvation, encompassing me with the armor of faith and the shield of a good will. By it, let my vices be done away, all lustful desires extinguished. May it advance me in charity, patience, humility, obedience, and every other virtue. Let it be strong defense against the wiles of all my enemies, visible and invisible, allaying for me every disturbance of flesh and spirit, binding me firmly to You, the one true God, and bringing my last hour to a happy close. I pray, too, that it may be Your pleasure to call my sinful self one day to that banquet, wonderful past all telling, where You, with Your Son and the Holy Spirit, feast Your saints with the vision of Yourself, who are true light, the fulfillment of all desires, the joy that knows no ending, gladness unalloyed, and perfect bliss: through the same Christ our Lord.

## WHAT IS A JUBILEE?

In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. Pope Boniface VIII declared the first Jubilee on February 22, 1300.

In ancient Judaism, the Jubilee Year was when Mosaic law prescribed that slaves could regain their freedom, and that land, (of which God is the sole master), should be returned to its former owners.

## WHY MAKE A PILGRIMAGE?

A pilgrimage is a journey with a purpose. It is an experience of conversion, of transforming one's very being to conform to the holiness of God. A pilgrimage during the Jubilee Year 2025 offers a unique opportunity for us to deepen our Faith, experience God's grace, and embrace the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope."

## WHAT IS THE JUBILEE LOGO?

The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth, uniting all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is a sign of faith and hope. There are rough waves under the figures, symbolizing life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly. The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. The cross bends down towards humanity, stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK – DECEMBER 21ST

St. Peter Canisius was born to Jacob Kanis, a wealthy burgermeister and Ægidia van Houweningen in 1521 in Nijmegen in the Duchy of Guelders which comprises modern day Netherlands. Ægidia died shortly after Peter's birth. After graduating from the University of Cologne with a Master's Degree in 1540, he met Peter Faber, one of the founding members of the Jesuit Order, and through him was influenced to become the first Dutch Jesuit in 1543. Canisius' priesthood was during the birth of the Protestant Reformation and owing to his brilliant preaching and writing, he staunchly defended Catholicism as the one true faith. In Germany, Protestantism portrayed Catholicism as the religion of the ignorant and Canisius worked to dispel this position with convincing truths. Canisius became entangled in a dispute with the court of Emperor Ferdinand I that had appointed a married priest as the court preacher. Canisius convinced Ferdinand himself of the ramifications such action would have on his rule. Ferdinand retracted the appointment of Phauser who begrudged Peter Canisius for this the rest of his life. Peter was a devout promoter of the Virgin Mary and many of his writings posited that adoration and supplication to her was the best path to Jesus. Through his education and talents, he contributed greatly to the reforms made during the Council of Trent. He also had a lasting impression on the manner in which Jesuits received their formation at the College of Saint Michel in Fribourg. Peter also drafted three catechisms in Latin and German that were highly acclaimed in Germany. In 1591, Peter suffered a debilitating stroke at age 70 that rendered him partially paralyzed, but he continued to preach and write through the help of his aides. He died later that year. He was canonized a saint by Pope Pius IX in 1864 and Doctor of the Church by Pius XI on May 21, 1925. Patron of the Catholic Press.
